FROM OUR LITERATURE...

What does "Being of Service" mean in Narcotics Anonymous ?

Our literature says that our primary purpose in Narcotics Anonymous is to "Carry the message to the addict who still suffers." We do this by being of service. Service comes in many forms and can be undertaken by anyone. Often NA members will share about "being of service" in our regular meetings. When we are new, it's easy to wonder "exactly what does that means." Though some NA service centers (such as the World Service Office) have special workers who are paid, the majority of tasks completed for NA are completed by individual members who volunteer their time. Meetings don't just happen; we have to make them happen.

Why should I get involved in NA service?

This is easy to answer as "We only keep what we have by giving it away." Our greatest tool for carrying out our primary purpose is the NA group, and without individuals doing service, the NA group would not survive. In our Basic Text it says that "Our survival is directly related to the survival of the group and the Fellowship." We have also found that service is an integral part of personal recovery in NA and allows us to receive the full benefits that this program has to offer. Our literature also says that "The therapeutic value of one addict helping another is without parallel." You've probably heard NA members share how good it makes them feel to be involved in service. One of the things we learn in our recovery is that the core of our disease is self-obsession.

Ultimately, being of service to NA is one way many of our members choose to demonstrate their gratitude for all that NA has given to them.

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Since I have been in Narcotics Anonymous, I have been somewhat of service; mostly in my home group. I was of service, not because I thought it would help me stay clean or for any altruistic reasons. I was of service, because I thought it was what was expected of me and it might make me look better in the eyes of my fellow NA members. Quite frankly, being of service was a chore. I didn't enjoy it, although I did get a kick out of being a secretary of a meeting or the chip guy simply because it was a way of saying, "look at me being of service" without actually saying it! However, all of that changed on Thanksgiving Day 2019.

For some reason, I decided to volunteer for the BHS Thanksgiving Marathon meetings. I figured I would go for an hour, show my face, clean up a little around the food area, listen to a speaker, and then leave. I had always thought that only the saddest, loneliest people in NA attended holiday marathon meetings. So my one hour would say that I was being of service, but not so sad or lonely that I "needed" to stay for more than one meeting. Boy, was I in for a surprise!

As I sat listening to the speaker, I started looking around the room. I watched the trusted servants effortlessly doing their thing and the meeting coordinators running the meetings as smoothly as possible. After SIX hours of the Thanksgiving Marathon meeting, I was completely absorbed in the love, attitude of giving, and fellowship that permeated every meeting. I was amazed at the selflessness of those who brought food, set it up, and helped serve, as well as the overt gratitude of nearly everyone in attendance. Yes, ladies and gentlemen, I had a bonafide, hallelujah-inducing, shout-to-the-rooftops spiritual awakening!

My whole attitude changed, not just about how I felt or viewed service work, but about Narcotics Anonymous as a whole. I actually felt a part of NA - an actual integral member - for the first time in my "career" as a recovery addict. For the first time in the many years that I had tried to get clean and stay clean, I felt as if I belonged. I cannot really explain it in any other way than it was a true spiritual awaking. My whole attitude about service completely changed. I realized that being of service had very little, if anything, to do with me, but rather it had everything to do with giving back to that "which so freely gave to me." I realized having a servant's heart meant doing whatever was needed in order to keep the doors open - just as the trusted servants of the Thanksgiving Marathon were doing.

After processing my spiritual awakening and what it truly meant, I realized there were several tenets that I would use to guide my new understanding of being of service. For me, being of service must mean serving in anonymity as much as possible. I realized that because of my ego, I cannot tell others about my service in or outside of NA. As soon as I talk about what I do for others or for NA, the focus of the service becomes about me - not the service itself. I also realized I must be of service without expecting any "thank you's" or pats on the back. I realized that I must be of service to honor my God and to serve NA. I must be of service, because it is a privilege and it will help me get out of "self." I must be of service simply because I want to. And finally, I must serve because...

being of SERVICE will help me stay clean.

I am a changed man. I am willing to open my mind to the spiritual possibilites of NA. I have been changed before. Just as I begin to make amends for that life, by moving on to Step Three, I suddenly have reservations about turning my life over to God's care. My mind began obsessing. I got all this clean time and I'm still obsessing over some hurt, pain, abandonment, humiliation, betrayal, worry and stress issues. What the hell, man! These feelings just popped out of nowhere. Why now? I hate when I take myself way too seriously. Thinking about those feelings can wake my disease up long enough for it to do some damage. Acting out on a lack of faith will fill me with an expectation of some approaching disaster. Spiritual confinement isolates me and robs me from the benefits of the program. Until I know for sure what's going on, I am alone. I know how to be I will intellectualize and that. rationalize the darkness until it gives up its secrets, because something is coming out of the void.

Reservations keep me from working and applying Step Three. Reservations are little demons in my head telling me I won't have peace of mind if I don't do it my way. I want and crave the softer and easier way. I have all this clean time and I watched a lot of my friends just up and run away. The people I love fail me. I see heartbreaks, the loss of my father, concerns about my finances, stress over my job, anxiety attacks, worrying about my health and this damn worldwide pandemic. I'm stuck with a whole lot of difficulties. I'm stuck and acting unmanageable, using my uncanny ability to blame God, because of my fear to accept responsibilities for my failures.


NA taught me I can choose a selfless way of living. I was confused and hurt until NA explained my primary purpose. Going to meetings, praying in the morning, being of service, and talking and listening to recovering addicts removes and keeps my reservations arrested. My ability to get honest with myself is restored. I don't have to trust my That's where my thinking. disease lies. I was blessed with a spirit that refuses to quit and find purpose. NA ignites that fire. Instead of taking my feelings so seriously, I believe through some sort of faith that even though it feels impossible, I know that God will love me and care for me. I fought my way through writing, studying, and prayer to have an understanding of faith. My faith is a relationship. It's a relationship with God from seeking as I invite Him to help me to stay clean no matter what my experiences are. I found out that through those clean-living experiences, He will act as my loving father. T convince myself through prayer that God is not punishing me. I have experiences that He directed me, protected me, and lead me to peace, because I stayed clean no matter what. I can become selfless and use my "keep coming back power" to turn it over at any time. I'm ready to look under the bed and face the monster that lives there.

Even though I am always afraid, I have the power to do the footwork with the gratitude that is now embedded in my soul, thanks to the recovery process of Narcotics Anonymous. I don't have to take my feelings seriously. Accepting that means I am ready to take on a whole new level of living on life's terms and grow the hell up.

I am a changed man. There's something different about me since Step Two. I feel it. I have been changed before. I can hear the guiding voices of NA say "Take my will and my life. Guide me in my recovery. Show me how to live."

That Third Step Prayer directs me and changes me into something different. I've become a different man. I found that life is fragile. My life is fragile. I am ready for a change.

I am no longer willing to let those pains and conflicts from my past control me. I'm going to continue to experience God's will. I want more of God's Will. Surrendering to His Will means finding peace amd learning to be at peace with peace. I will continue to stand in faith for the rest of my life. I am not going to give up on finding peace. I love this world, my world, because it feels balanced thanks to Step Three.

As you probably know, NA World Services has been financially affected by the global pandemic. . Even before the crisis hit, we were discussing how to shift our financial model from one that relies upon literature sales to a more sustainable model that depends upon member contributions. It's a huge shift and we know it won't happen overnight, but over time.

One way members can help is to consider making a recurring monthly contribution to World Services: <u>www.na.org/contribute</u>. Some of us contribute the amount of our clean time each month, some more, some less. In February, 50 members had recurring contributions. As of this writing, there are more than 500. Our first goal in the journey to become self-supporting through member contributions is to increase the number of recurring monthly contributions to 1,000 by the end of October.

We recognize that not everyone is able to contribute financially. Some of us contribute more through service or sponsorship. Thank you for doing your part whatever that is. We appreciate everything that members do to carry the message and grow NA. That no addict seeking recovery need ever die from the horrors of addiction.
